Knowledge translation is gaining international recognition as a way to close this knowledge to action gap.

Knowledge translation is the exchange, synthesis and ethically sound application of knowledge within a complex system of interactions among researchers and users to accelerate the capture of the benefits of research for patients through improved health, more effective services and products, and a strengthened health care system².

This seminar will draw on the experiences of both international and national knowledge translation experts to provide information on what knowledge translation is and how to do it.
